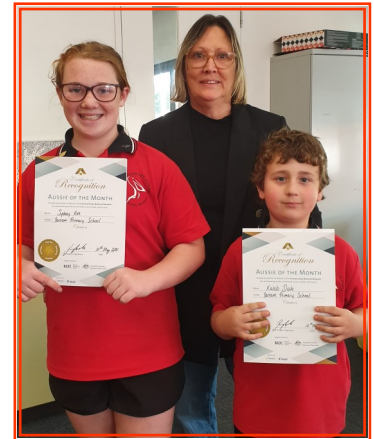

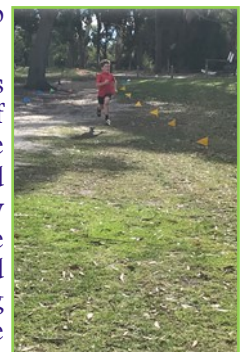
We have found in the past, the children might know the content, but found it challenging when asked to apply it. These skills are life skills—think of all the forms you need to know how to fill in as an adult!
